ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the Court on Plaintiff, Goyard St-Honore’s Motion for Preliminary Injunction [ECF No. 18], filed on November 24, 2025. Plaintiff asks the Court to enter a preliminary injunction against Defendants, preventing them from further use of Goyard’s trademarks. (Mot. 1).


While a temporary restraining order may be issued without notice to the adverse party, a preliminary injunction is issued after the adverse party has received notice of the requested relief. *See* Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b)(1) (“The court may issue a temporary restraining order without written or oral notice to the adverse party” (alteration added)); *id.* 65(a)(1) (“The court may issue a preliminary injunction only on notice to the adverse party.”). There is no indication on the docket that Defendants 6, 10, and 23 have been served with the Complaint [ECF No. 1]. The Complaint does not certify Defendants have been served, nor have Defendants appeared in this action. (*See generally* Compl.). Thus, a preliminary injunction is not procedurally proper.
